Late Absentee Ballot Application Instructions

Can I vote by absentee ballot? Yes, if you are a registered voter in Maryland.

How do I get an absentee ballot?

1. Complete and **sign** the late absentee ballot application.
2. Go to your county board of elections to submit the completed application. You or your agent must submit your completed application **in person** no later than 8 pm on election day.
3. After you submit your completed application, your county board of elections will issue you an absentee ballot.
4. Either vote the ballot and return it while you are at the election office or take the ballot with you. If you take the ballot with you, you must return or mail the voted ballot by the deadline.
 - o If you hand deliver your ballot, you must deliver it to your county board of elections by 8 pm on election day.
 - o If you mail your ballot, it must be mailed on or before election day **and** received by your county board of elections by September 22, 2010 (primary election) or November 12, 2010 (general election).

Can someone help me with this form? Yes, if you have a disability or are unable to read or write. Any person can help you, except a candidate on your ballot, your employer or an agent of your employer, or an officer or agent of your union. The person can help you with Parts 1 and 2 and must complete Part 3. If you cannot sign this form, the person helping you should print your name in Part 2 and write his or her initials after your name.

Can someone pick up my absentee ballot and bring it to me? Yes, if you complete the *Designation of Agent* form (available at your county board of elections or at www.elections.state.md.us – “Absentee Voting”). The person you name must be at least 18 years old and not a candidate on your ballot. This person must sign, under penalty of perjury, that he or she gave you your ballot and if you wish, returned your voted ballot to the local board of elections.
